Dear Parent/Guardian

In order to facilitate planning for next year's Sixth Form Curriculum your son/daughter is being asked to select, provisionally his/her subjects for next year.

It is important to emphasise that pupils require 14 points (where A\* = 4; A = 3; B = 2; C\* = 1.5, C = 1) to return to the Sixth Form. In addition, students with 23 or more points may take 4 AS levels and those with 30 points or more are expected to do so.

Pupils who opt to study the **BTEC Diploma** in Physical Education who do attain GCSE 12 or 13 points may still be considered for entry. Please contact the school directly once results are published.

Each individual AS / BTEC subject will have specific subject criteria, this information has been published on the school website <http://www.wallacehigh.org/about/academic/>

Irrespective of the number of AS subjects eventually taken, we are asking the pupils to choose provisionally four subjects at this stage. A decision on whether three or four AS levels will be taken (and if appropriate, which three from the four selected) will be made during our Sixth Form Intake following the issue of GCSE results in August.

### **Accelerated Mathematics**

This year pupils will have the option of studying 'Accelerated Mathematics' in Block B. This is the full CCEA A-level studied during one year of study (Year 13). Pupils in this class will have the option of studying Further Mathematics in Year 14. Pupils opting for this option must be taking three other AS subjects.

### **Physical Education BTEC**

In September 2019 Physical Education BTEC replaced the current A-level in PE. Pupils have the choice of Extended Certificate (equivalent to one A-level) in Block A or Diploma Award (equivalent to two A-levels) by choosing PE in Block A&C.

Further information on both awards is available from the appropriate Head of Department. Mr S Alexander (Head of Mathematics), Mr N Hinds (Head of Physical Education).

Appendix 1 outlines some of the issues concerning subject choice itself and consideration of these will be useful when choosing subject combinations.

## Appendix 1

- For a subject to be taken at AS/A2 there are subject-specific requirements as outlined in the accompanying Sixth Form Prospectus.
- All AS subjects provided will be available as an A2 level in Upper Sixth.
- Choose **three or four** subjects, one from each option block, from the option boxes provided. No more than **one** subject can be selected from each option box.
- It is important to note that where applicable, pupils intending to take an AS level science subject must achieve at least a minimum mark in the appropriate science component of GCSE Double Award Science – see prospectus for specific details.
- Although pupils can select three or four AS levels in Year 13, **most** pupils (except those studying Accelerated Maths) will only take three A2 subjects in Upper Sixth, irrespective of whether three or four AS subjects were studied. However, it is possible for pupils to continue with all four AS subjects into A2 level in Upper Sixth.
- The **subject choice meeting on 20th March** will give pupils and parents / guardians an opportunity to discuss the career implications of choices. Please bring the completed pro-forma showing choices made along to that meeting.
- If the number of pupils opting to take a particular subject at AS level is very low, the school reserves the right to withdraw the offer.
