MUSIC

The Music Department was all set for a fabulous year in 2019-2020. After a very successful tour the previous June to Corpus Christi College in Cambridge, the Honours began the year with an hour recital in Thiepval Barracks. The group had 5 days to develop the close harmony, choral blend for which they are well known. The event was made up of various a cappella works, and solo items and the audience were extremely receptive to the high quality musicianship presented by the group.

As term continued, all parts of the Music Department were busy. From the Year 8 concert in October, to the preparations for the annual #decoratewithmusic programme in December, the programme of events was quite demanding. Six lower 6th students travelled each Tuesday to Parkview Special school to join the sensory choir. This is a deeply rewarding aspect of the Music Department's social engagement. The Honours joined the sensory choir, the marathon choir and

the school choir for their Christmas assembly. The orchestral honours and choral honours performed for a captive audience at the Royal Victoria Hospital for Sick Children, the atrium resounding with Christmas cheer, the sound wafting up through the wards and into the ICU.

The Carol concert in St Patrick's featured some new carols, The Sussex carol in particular, and ended with the tradition procession of Carol of the Bells. Prize day featured a fabulous jazz performance of Jingle Bells, à la Michael Bublé and the Puppini sisters.



The new year, with the shadow of Covid 19 in the background, got off to a great start, Open Morning performances were well received and included Orchestral, Jazz and Choral favourites. We were invited to perform a concert for the Lord Mayor in the Island Centre at the start of February, in collaboration with Pond Park Primary school. SPORTS REPORTS

SENIOR BOYS RUGBY

The 2019-2020 Wallace High School IstXV will be remembered as one of the most skilful and breathtakingly attack-minded squads ever to grace the pitches of The Wallace High School. They retained the ability to score tries from all areas of the pitch even in the most pressurised of situations and were able to win against all top Ulster Schools. However, on the other side of the ball, especially in The Schools' Cup Semi-Final victory over holders Methodist College (MCB), it was their attitude and physicality in defence which saw them through to The Schools' Cup Final.

The core of the squad, was undoubtedly, our Year 14 pupils, Reuben Crothers (Capt.), Harry McMeekin, Jamie McNeight, Joel Dundas, Nathan Doak, Jack Dillon, Lewis Nelmes and Ben Carson. In The Schools' Cup run, these were the go-to men who had experience and maturity to make decisions in pressurised situations and enabled the team to find a way to solve problems. Their need to win was contagious and adopted by the upcoming Year 12 and 13 pupils and facilitated the formation of a formidable squad.

The ability of our Year 14 pupils was evident from the early days in Year 8, when they were unbeaten throughout the season and won both the C.A.I. and Down H.S. Tournaments. In beating Willow Park in the final of the C.A.I. tournament they became the first Wallace team to win this prestigious competition.

The success of the 2019-2020 squad was not solely down to this year group. The skill progression, hard work and dedication of the Year 12 & 13 pupils in the squad was also a major factor in the success achieved. Pupils such as Charlie Irvine, Peter Heasley, Harry Wallace, Scott Wilson, Thomas Brolly, Finn Rankin and Cameron Doak all showed tremendous passion and commitment. With much of the attention going to our high flying year 14s, it was these pupils who developed

physicality, mental toughness, resilience and a desire to improve their personal performance. These guys, along with the other Year 12 and 13 members of the Senior squad will become the core players for future years and hopefully their experiences from this year will help them to further the rugby reputation and traditions of Wallace HS. The season began with the opening fixture with St.Gerard's, Bray on Saturday 31st August. With so many players involved in Ulster Schools' matches, preparation had been affected and but it was a solid opening victory at home by 26-12. A 31-27 loss away to Ballymena Academy proved to be our only defeat of the season to Ulster opposition and this was quickly followed by victories versus CCB, Enniskillen RGS and RS Armagh. Further victories against MCB, RBAI, Ballymena Academy and Roscrea proved to be significant and added to the squad's belief and confidence as the 2020 Schools' Cup appeared on the horizon.

The Schools' Cup Campaign 2020

The Schools' Cup began on Saturday 8th February, 2020 with an away victory at Bangor GS by 33-6. Captain Reuben Crothers put in an immense performance and scored two tries, Harry McMeekin, Ben Carson and Nathan Doak scored a try apiece and Nathan Doak kicked four conversions. In the quarter-final, a very talented Enniskillen GS arrived at Wallace and in a tense affair, Wallace booked their semi-final place with a 19-10 victory thanks to tries from Cameron Doak, Finn Rankin and Peter Heasley. Nathan Doak kicked two conversions.

Schools' Cup Semi-Final

Around seven hundred pupils and staff left Wallace HS on a beautiful early March afternoon on thirteen buses. Expectation and excitement were palpable as face painting, supporter signs and chanting echoed around school. MCB were the cup holders and would not give up their title easily. We were not to be disappointed, as a cracking semi-final between two well drilled outfits graced the Kingspan Stadium.



Wallace started the game with intent and asked questions of MCB's defence and it was not long before Wallace got on the scoresheet through a well-taken Nathan Doak penalty.

The Belfast side had opportunities to come back into the game in the opening quarter, but Wallace's defence held firm through excellent tackling, organisation and accurate defensive ruck decision making. This gave Wallace a number of key turnovers which helped to alleviate pressure.

However, after a prolonged attack from MCB, a fantastic cross-field kick allowed their right wing to go over for their first try.

Wallace soon responded, when centre Jack Dillon showed real acceleration to weave his way through the MCB defence to score under the posts.





Just a minute later, Dillon's centre partner, Ben Carson, created a further try on the stroke of half time, his strong running making it impossible for MCB's defence to stop.

Nathan Doak duly fired over both conversions to leave the half-time score:

Wallace had to absorb a lot of pressure early in the second half, however Wallace's line out defence, tackling and the boot of Nathan meant the Belfast side couldn't turn pressure into points. Wallace scored their third try through the influential Jamie McNeight who went over in the corner after a fantastic team move involving multiple phases.

MCB capitalised on a yellow card to score their second try and followed this up with a converted try in the dying minutes. However, it was too little too late and not enough to snatch the lead from the Lisburn side.



In September, the 1st XI Super League kicked the school hockey calendar off. Results here are important in the seeding process for the main Senior Schools' Cup. We found ourselves in a strong group and failed to gain a seeded place this year, but watched with interest when BRA and FSL, top two in our section, dominated the annual Senior Schools' Cup competition, meeting in the main schools' final, where BRA prevailed. In October, the senior squad travelled to Glasgow to compete in the Topflight Tournament where they gained valuable experience against highly rated home nations teams. At junior level, the Under 14 squads demonstrated real improvement in their maturity of play and tactical awareness. The Under 14 A were narrowly beaten 2-1 in the junior cup by Royal School Dungannon and exited to Rainey in the plate with the B Squad showing pleasing progress in individual and team play over the course of the season. The Under 13s and Under 12s have a breadth of talent and show much potential for the future.

Several under 13s were selected to train with the under 14s as part of their development and this experience should be beneficial when they step up permanently next season. The under 12s had weekly Friday matches from November starting with 8 -a-side and transitioning to the full full 11-a-side game from January.
