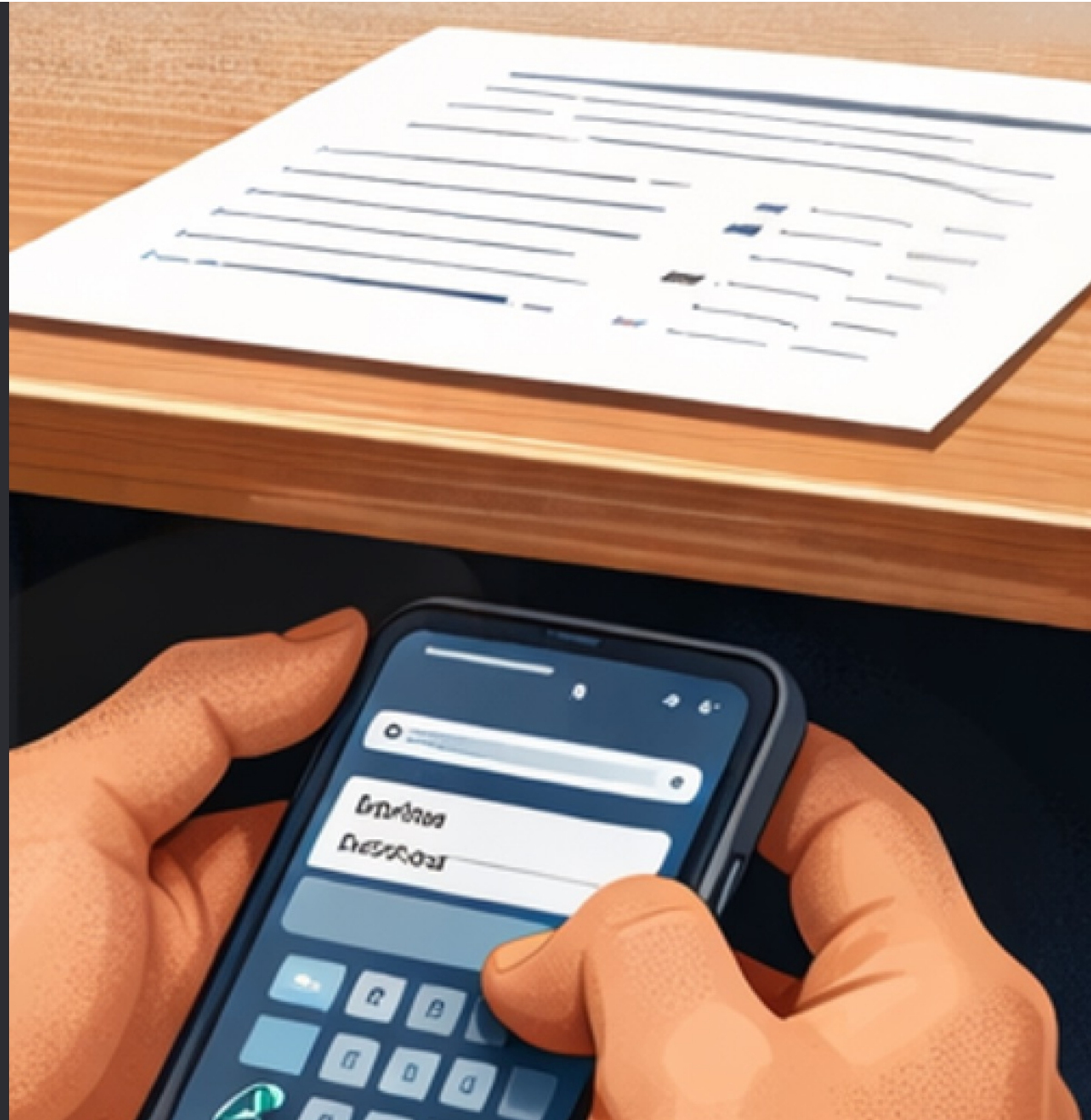
## 2 TYPES OF MALPRACTICE



- Intentional
- Unintentional

## INTENTIONAL

- Deliberately cheating or trying to cheat in an exam.
- *Would result in zero for that unit.*
- *You may also lose the subject grade.*
- *possibility of losing **ALL** your grades.*





## UNINTENTIONAL

- Taking a mobile phone **into** the exam hall.
- Taking a watch **into** the exam hall.
- Verbal or non verbal communication during the exam.

- Verbal or non verbal communication during the distribution or collection of papers.
- Taking any written material **into** the exam hall.



## SUSPECTED MALPRACTICE

The sanction for malpractice in an **external** exam is likely to result in **loss of the grade** in that subject.

Being accused of malpractice involves a lengthy investigation that may not conclude until the **August** result date.

The investigation can be a distraction from your other examinations.

Malpractice **can** result in loss of a unit grade, whole subject grade, and even **all grades**.





Check and double check that you **DO NOT** have a phone or watch on your person.

Once the invigilator has started the process engage only with your paper.

If you have forgotten something (e.g. calculator) put your hand up and wait for an invigilator.



The exam state only ends when the **last** paper is collected.

**Do not** nod, smile, speak, gesture to anyone until the invigilator dismisses you.

Zero communication during exam clash quarantine.
